We in Cooley Primary School have the responsibility for the care, welfare and safety of our pupils and we seek to support pupil's development in ways to foster security, confidence and independence. This is viewed as central to the well being of each individual and therefore is seen to be an intrinsic part of all aspects of the curriculum.

ETHOS

Cooley Primary School and Nursery Unit provide a warm, welcoming, happy and caring environment where all are nurtured, valued and respected as part of our Christian ethos. In partnership with parents/carers, wider school family and local community, we offer high quality learning experiences to enable every child to reach their full potential.

PRINCIPLES

Our Child Protection Policy is based on the following principles, as the child's welfare must always be paramount:

- Children have a right to be heard, listened to and taken seriously.
- > Every child has the fundamental right to be safe from harm and have

proper care given to its physical, emotional and spiritual well being.

PRACTICES

We at Cooley Primary School take the following steps to protect our pupils.

- All staff will have clear guidance on the action, which is required, where abuse of a child is suspected.
- All staff will undergo a vetting procedure in order to maintain the highest standards of professional care.
- All staff will receive Child Protection training.
- Children will be supervised at all times while in the school grounds.
- When it is necessary for a child to travel on a different bus from their normal one, written permission must be given by a parent/guardian.
- Bullying is a highly distressing and damaging form of abuse and will not be tolerated in our school. All staff will be vigilant and will aim to prevent it by raising awareness with pupils, staff and parents.


All staff at Cooley Primary School will ensure that pupils are aware of who they can talk to if they are sad, worried, being bullied or have any other concerns.

The Designated Teacher for Child Protection is Mrs Carrothers and the deputy Mrs Mitchell will assume responsibility in her absence. The Designated Governor for Child Protection is Mr McFaul.

The Department of Education of Northern Ireland requires all those working in education to co-operate fully with social services and other agencies to protect children. It is therefore our duty to refer if there is a concern about any form of abuse.
